Steven M. Skala AO is Vice Chairman, Australia and New Zealand, of Deutsche Bank AG. He is Chairman of Wilson HTM Investment Group Limited, and is a Director of the Australian Broadcasting Corporation and a Director of Hexima Limited, Vice President of the Board of the Walter & Eliza Hall Institute of Medical Research, Deputy Chairman of the General Sir John Monash Foundation and a Director of the Centre for Independent Studies.

Mr Skala serves as a Member of the International Council of the Museum of Modern Art (MoMA) in New York, the Advisory Council of the Australian Innovation Research Centre and the Grievance Tribunal of Cricket Australia. He is a past Chairman of Film Australia Limited and the Australian Centre for Contemporary Art, a former director of Max Capital Group Limited, the Channel Ten Group, The King Island Company Limited and The Australian Ballet, and a former Trustee of the Sir Zelman Cowen Foundation for Medical Research. Steven holds the degrees of Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Laws (Hons) from the University of Queensland and Bachelor of Civil Laws from Oxford University.

Between 1985 and 2004 he was a Partner and Head of the Corporate and Commercial Practice of Arnold Bloch Leibler, Solicitors. In 2010 he was appointed an Officer of the Order of Australia for service to the arts, education, business and commerce.
