Cold outside warm inside we explored the ABC/SBS programs and trends. Our new Minute Secretary's friendly agenda worked well with all business completed by midday. Some refinements are needed, in particular my wanderings from the agenda despite my own Peta C. holding my hand.

In response to questions from Members, Mal Hewitt has confirmed that the ABC School Programs, Behind the News and Music Programs are no longer broadcast but are available online if teachers choose to include them. Play School (which is pre-School) continues to be broadcast.

While lunch orders were warming up your Committee met briefly to discuss several items and all were resolved with Helen Routledge and Bev Redshaw confirmed as new Committee Members. Under a recent S.M.H. headline "Peppa Pig is the future of ABC TV" — Managing Director Mark Scott by explanation confirmed that audience habits are shifting to a world of content and demand. More than 70 percent of ABC iView traffic comes via mobile services, 16 percent from the ABC website and just 14 percent by connected TV and the ABC's audience was aggressively taking to streaming. So that we can, if we wish, change our viewing habits and ways in which we use the ABC programs viewing or listening.



SPRINGWOOD FOUNDATION DAY MARCH 14 2015

Our branch was represented in the parade this year by a very small but enthusiastic group of members including the NSW president, Mal Hewitt and branch president, Barry Redshaw.

Making Australia Great – Inside Our Longest Boom. ABC Tuesday 8.30pm. Three part series from 17 March 2015.

This documentary by author and journalist George Megalogenis looked at the past 50 years of economic and social history through the testimonies of the prime ministers, treasurers and Reserve Bank insiders.

The series was made more interesting with the recent death of our 22nd Prime Minister John Malcolm Fraser on 20 March 2015.

Malcolm Fraser is being remembered as Australia's most divisive leader for orchestrating the Whitlam dismissal, (although they reconciled in the 1990s becoming friends and sharing a deep mutual respect on many issues) and our most humanitarian for ushering in Aboriginal land rights, encouraging immigration and multiculturalism and launching SBS. He welcomed over 50,000 Vietnamese refugees (the first boat people) and pressured Commonwealth nations for the abolition of apartheid in South Africa.

The ABC also broadcast, 'Life Wasn't Meant To Be Easy', a memorial tribute to Malcolm Fraser in one of his final major interviews conducted by George Megalogenis on Sunday 22 March.
