## Address by Susan Templeman, Federal Member for Macquarie and Special Envoy for the Arts

We were pleased to welcome Ms Templeman to our July branch meeting at the Grand View Hotel.

Ms Templeman outlined her parliamentary work as **Special Envoy for the Arts**, in which she reports to the Prime Minister and the Minister for the Arts, Tony Bourke. She sees as essential the need to reach out to non-ALP members of parliament in order to promote discussion of the arts. A priority is the need to legislate the provision of Australian content quotas on streaming services and inclusion of the ABC "within that ecosystem". With particular regard to the ABC, she promotes to MPs the importance of the national broadcaster within the government's National Cultural Policy, giving as an example the ABC's role in providing opportunities for emerging arts practitioners.

Ms Templeman also spoke about the **Parliamentary ABC Friends** group, of which she is a member, explaining that the parliamentary Friends are concerned to keep abreast of developments concerning the ABC and within the broadcaster. She explained that the group is co-chaired by three MPs:

one from the ALP (currently Dr Mike Freelander), one from the Liberal Party and a third from minor parties or independents. She noted that an **annual ABC Showcase** visits the Federal parliament and is well-attended by MPs of all persuasions.

She emphasised the Labor government's commitment to the managerial and editorial independence of the ABC, noting the provision of the five-year funding cycle and the sum of \$742m for the ABC and SBS to continue valuable programs such as enhanced news gathering and audio description of broadcasts. She stated that the Albanese government "wants the ABC to feel assured of resourcing and funding" and affirmed her personal commitment to funding of ABC radio as an essential emergency broadcaster.



Governments have a responsibility to "talk up the ABC", Ms Templeman believes: "We are a weaker society if the ABC has weakened its reportage."

She praised the work of ABC Friends, emphasising that our public visibility "is so important" in promoting the national broadcaster in its task of "exposing Australians to Australian stories".

She closed by encouraging branch members to contact her office if they have questions or branch resolutions for her attention.
